Welcome to Buckeye Woods Park, Schleman Nature Preserve & Chippewa Inlet Trail...



The three-acre lake at Buckeye Woods Park is a great location to cast your line.



Pioneers in the Park is an annual event that takes place at the park in October.

Named for the graceful stands of buckeye trees along its creek, Buckeye Woods Park offers a diversity of terrain and activities. In the western half of the park, explore the natural heritage of the site along trails that wind through woods and meadow in the Schleman Nature Preserve. The eastern portion of the park is an active recreation area with play fields, a three-acre lake, picnic, and playground areas. Found near the headwaters of the Chippewa Creek, Buckeye Woods Park would best be described as a wet woods.

Low-lying areas along the creek provide ideal growing conditions for Ohio buckeye trees, red maples and a very impressive bur oak specimen. A large monoculture of crataegus can be found in the eastern portion of the park. This unique situation came to be decades ago when this area of the park was being pastured. The cattle consumed everything except the thorny hawthorn tree seedlings. As time passed, the trees dominated the site, shading out most other plant life. The original park, the west end, was a restricted donation by Theda Schleman. In the past, the eastern end was farmed as part of the county infirmary farm of the Medina County Home.

The *Chippewa Inlet Trail* is a 1.75-mile asphalt trail running along the Chippewa Inlet from Buckeye Woods Park to the Chippewa Nature

Area located on the east side of the inlet. This nature area provides opportunities to see a vast array of wildlife. Visitors enjoy hiking, biking, and rollerblading along the trail. This wide valley runs along the Chippewa stream, providing a much-needed

travel corridor for local wildlife and a stopover for many long-distance bird migrants. American avocets, sandhill cranes, American bittern and bald eagles all have been seen in the valley.


