HOW TO GET TO Hampton Hills Metro Park.

Hampton Hills is located off Akron-Peninsula Rd. within Akron and Cuyahoga Falls, between Steels Corners and Bath Roads.

2925 Akron-Peninsula Rd., Akron

From State Rt. 8: Exit at Steels Corners Rd. Go west on Steels Corners Rd. approx. five mi. to Akron-Peninsula Rd. Turn south on Akron-Peninsula Rd. and go 1/4 mi. to the main park entrance on the left.

- Bats will emerge from the barn at dusk!






