



ON NATURE PRESERVES

Headlands Dunes is one of a statewide system of nature preserves that have been established under the Ohio Natural Areas Act of 1970. The Act provides for the permanent protection and preservation of areas which contain scientifically and educationally valuable examples of Ohio's native plant and animal communities, geological features, or the habitats of rare and endangered species. The preserves are intended to be used solely for research, nature study, bird watching, hiking, art, photography and other non-consumptive uses. The collection of any natural material in the preserve is strictly prohibited. Mass recreational activities, picnicking, camping, swimming, organized sports, or the use of motorized vehicles are also prohibited.

These living museums are one of our greatest resources and they belong to everyone who loves nature and the out-of-doors. However, because they are priceless and irreplaceable, they must be carefully protected so they can be passed on unimpaired for future generations.

The preserve is open daylight to dark, seven days a week.
